


































[SCOUTS] District Field Day




[VENTURE SCOUTS] PSA Presentation Ceremony




What comes to mind when the few of us think of our scouting days has to be the Ubin Camp in March; the annual 'tekan' camp which makes or breaks an individual. Getting stripped down to basic necessities, and being put through many gruelling challenges in those three to four days really revealed and polished up one's character. Camping meals were by themselves quite an experience. I remember that we use to eat bread that was really squashed up after being stuffed into the rucksack, and outdoor cooking was always a funny affair with leaves and other extra 'ingredients' somehow winding up in the food.

The many useful survivor skills like starting a fire with just wood, grass and 3 matches, tying various knots and having handy first aid knowledge will always stay with me. So too would the many lessons, values and good habits such as always being well-prepared, taking pride and being the best in whatever I did. The whole scouting journey forged strong friendships and instilled confidence, initiative, leadership and a 'Die die Can Do' attitude in all of us.

Ironically, when looking back, it was the toughest moments that you recall and laugh about the most. It was also these trying times that you cherished the most because you knew that you had rose up to the challenge, conquered it and emerged a strong person than before. All these experiences made our lives rich and eventful, and made us the better person that we are today.

These experiences were a real privilege and a treasure that many others will never have the opportunity to share in. For those in the scout group today, you should know this and cherish your time now. You should do your best to learn as much as possible and face all challenges with a positive attitude, knowing that you will only come out a tougher and more capable person. 多个月前接到蔡三陵团长的来电,要我为这一期的〈营火〉提供一篇回忆录. 起笔之际,我的思绪不得不回到 1974 到 1979 这六年间在 2106 公教中学童军团里与所有兄弟们度过的美好时光。老实说,回想起当时每一次的集合与个别的话动,都是不同的经历与体验,根本无法——道来,只能略略与大家分享,其余有苦有乐的片段就让那年代的团友把时光倒流再回味一番吧!

这团部是由一群先辈亲手搭建起来的,别小看那幢小木屋,它可是五脏俱全!里头藏了几乎所有童军话动所需的配备,如斧头、锄头、汽灯、暴风灯、火水炉、巴冷刀、工具箱、绳箱及 小队箱等等,可说是应有尽有!小木屋里的横梁与柱子上也挂了童军创办人贝登堡的肖像、童军铭言与誓约,值得一提的是木屋里头还有大伙最爱爬上去偷闲的"小二楼"!除此之外还有竖立于团部院内雕刻精致的⑧腾、木棍架和独具一格的六个小队角。

我和一群小六生在 1973 年底被"征召"; 1974 年开学后经过一连串的面试、迎新等活动后正 式加入了童军团的老虎小队(TIGER PATROL)。与我同时被送进"虎口"的还有吴多濠、刘裕吉、马文权、林仲邦和卓可捷,队长是杨家铿。其他同届生则分别加入了PIGEON、EAGLE、CORRA、RHINO和 WOLF 小队。我在 1976 年也无端端的当上了TIGER 的队长。

童军生活多姿多彩,从中我们学到了许多课本以外的知识,例如:绳结、急救、烹饪、步操、爬山 涉水、领导才能以及如何安全和有效的运用各种工具和配备等等,当然更少不了大伙期待的 VOJ、远足、露营、打野战和营火会,还有一年一度意义非凡的童军工作周。但最重要 的还是培养了我们终生受益的自律、自信、不屈不挠和合作无间的团队精神。

露营期间我们回餐不缺,但质量不保,原因是材料由总营供应,各营的"佳肴"就得看命运咯!每一天的话动应该是从早晨的检查营地开始,之后则是紧凑的训练和竞技与趣味游戏,直到夜里熄灯,一天的疲劳轰炸才告"暂时"结束,接下来是轮流守夜。在那荒山野岭,夜黑风高的夜里要单独为自己的营地看守一个时辰,倒霉的话又碰上三急,如果设有几分胆识,要挨过那两小时简直是度时如年!

我们除了接受体能上的训练也不缺精神粮食,总营每天都会印刷营地报"号外"让我们阅读。这份报刊是在营地里撰稿编写的,必须将文章写在蓝色的蜡纸上,再以黑墨印刷出版,既费时又费力。一周的露营就在一场激烈的打野战和最后一夜欢歌笑语的营火会后落幕。那是一个极具意义又难忘的露营,难能可贵的是整个露营的运筹帷幄都是由一批非常热心、尽贵的年轻团长、助理团长与教练们策划的。

在初院的两年里,我还是继续留在团部成为先进军并担任起助理团长的工作,除了例常活动外,为促进各团间的友谊,我们还成功举办了史丹佛区篮球和足球比赛。

六年的童军生涯,可说是我学生时代最爽、最快乐的日子。经历过太多太多回味无穷的人与事,兄弟们也建立了深厚的友谊。身为童军的我尽最大的努力完成了任务,也得到了荣誉,但不得不承认,最让我遗憾的是见证了曾经让七十年代几届童军兄弟留下无限回忆的滑铁卢街2106 公教童军团走进历史!

藉此,我要向所有团长,助理团长,曾经一起度过美好时光的团友及陪我考完总统童军章的兄弟们表示衷心感谢!当然,还要向这几十年来不仅为我团也为新加坡童军活动作出无私奉献与服务的蔡三陵总团长致敬!并祝愿公教中学童军团与时并进,继续将我团的优良传统发扬光大!



FOO YONG JIN TIGER PATROL 1974-1977












JAPANESE SQUARE LASHING loop center around spar lead parallel wrapping turn 3. 4. wrapping



The Japanese Square Lashing's usage is the same as the basic square lashing. The main difference is in the way the lashing is started. First of all, the lashing is started by looping the center of the rope around the vertical beam so that it loops under the horizontal beam. Then, start the wrapping turns by going over the horizontal beam, behind the vertical, over the other side of the horizontal and again behind the vertical on the bottom part to complete one wrap. Do make sure that the wraps are 90 to the beams. After wrapping, start frapping by separating the strands so that one strand is above the horizontal beam and the other strand is below the horizontal beam. Frapping is done in opposite directions. Make at least two complete frapping turns and pull each turn tight as it is made. Finish the lashing with a reef knot behind the vertical beam by making a loop around the vertical with each end of the rope after frapping.
